
"Jesus said, 'I am the resurrection and the life. The one who believes in me will live, even though they die.'" John 11:25

Main Points:

- 1. Watch *Yourself* When God Doesn't *Make Sense*.
 - Scripture Reference: John 11:1, 3-4, 11, 16
 - Key Message: Despite our confusion, God's plans ultimately lead to His glory.
- 2. God's Delays Are Not God's Denials
 - Scripture Reference: John 11:17-27
 - Key Message: Trusting in God's timing, even when it seems late, leads to witnessing His glory.
- 3. Let Jesus Have the Last Word
 - Scripture Reference: John 11:38-44
 - Key Message: Surrendering to Jesus' authority allows His miracles to manifest in our lives.
- 4. The Resurrection is Not an Event; It's a Person
 - Scripture References: John 3:16; John 20:31
 - Key Message: Believing in Jesus brings eternal life and transforms our existence.

Group Life Questions

- 1. Reflecting on the statement "I am the resurrection and the life," how does Jesus' claim challenge conventional notions of life and death?
- 2. In the context of Lazarus' illness and death, what does Jesus' delay in coming signify about God's timing and purpose?
- 3. Martha expressed her belief in a general resurrection at the last day. How does Jesus' response redefine the concept of resurrection in a personal and immediate sense?
- 4. When faced with situations where God's actions seem incomprehensible, how can individuals maintain faith and trust in His plan?
- 5. Explore the significance of Jesus' command to remove the stone from Lazarus' tomb despite Martha's objections. What might this action symbolize in our lives today?
- 6. How does the resurrection of Lazarus serve as a demonstration of God's power and Jesus' authority?
- 7. Reflect on the statement, "Let Jesus have the last word." What does this mean practically in daily life, especially in times of difficulty or despair?
- 8. Discuss the idea that the resurrection is not merely an event but a person. How does this understanding transform our perception of Easter and its significance?
- 9. Considering John 3:16, how does belief in Jesus as the Son of God impact one's understanding of eternal life and salvation?
- 10. Reflecting on the overall message of the sermon, how does believing in Jesus as the resurrection and the life fundamentally change our perspective on life, death, and eternity?
